REVIEW OF VOLUNTEER TEAMS & ACCOMPLISHMENTS in 2021

Grants

Ken Leap reported that we successfully applied for a grant from Camden County Cultural Alliance. It was received and reviewed; final announcement is not expected until January. The State Arts gives funds to the counties, who give it to non-profit organizations. This year the "matching funds" requirement was waived, and there was no cap on the amount that could be requested. We asked for adequate funds for a mural to be painted on the outside wall of "Dee's Dance Studio," adjacent to Cook's florist shop on the Black Horse Pike.

For future grant writing efforts, **Deb Schmidt has volunteered to head proof-reading.**
More volunteers are needed for our grant writing team.

Cultivation of a Business Association

Reimagine Runnemede recognizes that working in tandem with a business association could expedite our common goals. Representatives from our team could offer assistance in making changes envisioned by Runnemede business owners (ie. facade upgrades) come to life.

Mike Consetti (of "Cob Fathers") has expressed an interest in heading up that committee. More volunteers for Business Association development are needed.

There have been 4 issues of our newsletter, well received by residents.

This effort was initiated by Cathy Gregory-Walker. She explained that it is an international day to celebrate giving, and it follows Cyber Monday. Our goal is \$2,000.00. There is a software program that shows a goal progress indicator, and incentive gifts will be given for certain donation amounts. Bobb, Jess and Nick are on our fundraising team, and Bobbiy created a frame to feature donors, who can then express in video or photographic form why they donated. The website for Giving Tuesday will be ready by 11/22, and people can choose to “champion” the cause, sharing with family and friends or share on Facebook. Thank You gifts are as follows:

\$50 or more=muse, and will receive a RIR calendar

Upcoming Centennial for Runnemede (in 2026) was brought up by Susan Rondeau, who would like to draft a letter to the English Monarchy, as we are a “sister city” to Runnymede, England. RIR will undoubtedly be involved in the planning and implementation of our 100th year celebration, and we realize the planning needs to start soon! John Ranieri envisions a lighthouse structure on the jetty at the David Vanella Memorial Park.

Ken mentioned that, historically, Runnemede broke off from a conglomerate of cities, originally known as Centerville.

NEW BUSINESS:

Winter Solstice Celebration at the Labyrinth is Tuesday, December 21st

Plans are being made to create paper lanterns at our potluck supper on 12/16.

These will serve as luminaries, to be mounted on sticks so they can be carried in a light parade and then installed at the labyrinth for enjoyment by drivers-by in the evening.

John Ranieri will ask Frank at the ice company in town about an ice sculpture, which could be placed in the center of the labyrinth. A stipend could be offered for this sculpture.
